<u>Curricula Complying with SB 71, the</u> <u>California Comprehensive Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Act</u>

This chart reviews a number of curricula that are nationally recognized as "research-validated" by entities such as the CDC and the California Department of Education. These curricula have been rigorously evaluated and found to be successful in changing adolescent sexual risk-taking behaviors.¹ However, some are dedicated to HIV/AIDS prevention while others are focused on sexuality education, and none are California-specific. As a result, they do not meet every requirement of SB 71 and will need to be selectively supplemented when used in California classrooms. For guidance, this chart shows the SB 71 requirements that each curriculum does and does not meet.
